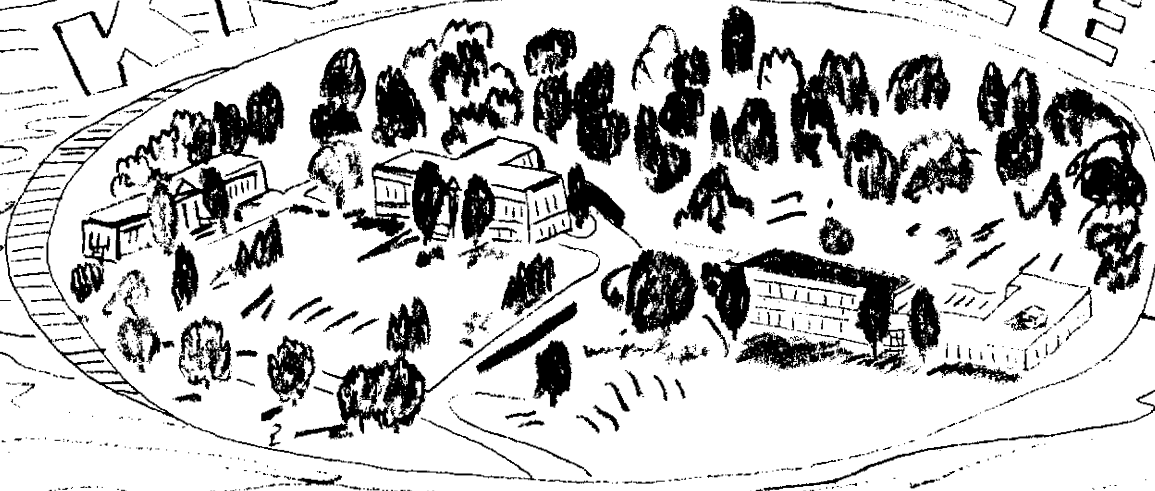

The season's first Forest Zoology Club program will start this Friday, October 9, at 8:00 P.M. in Room 222 Marshall Hall.

Speaker for the evening is Dr. Arthur R. Eschner, professor of silviculture at the College, who will describe a joint experiment by the U. S. Forest Service and the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and Wildlife on the effects of logging on trout: four experimental forest practices and their effect on water quality.

The talk will be illustrated, and Dr. Eschner, who worked for the Forest Service on the experiment, will answer questions during a discussion afterwards.
